



- To create an environment which is accessible to all learners regardless of their literacy and ICT skills.




Learner Entitlement

- Structure the environment to minimise distractions.











 The docking bar introduced in Moodle 2 allows learners to access specific 'blocks' without them constantly been a distraction.




- The use of hyperlinked images enables learners to easily access resources through a range of assistive technologies and devices






Summary




